- The Good News of God's Acceptance (Lev. 1:1-17)
 - 5 Features of the Burnt Offering
 - 1) Sacrifice was welcome from any part of society. (v. 3, 10, 14)
 - 2) The sacrifice had to be spotless. (vv. 3, 10)
 - 3) The sacrifice was a substitute. (v. 4)
 - 4) The sacrifice was completely surrendered. (vv. 9, 13, 17)
 - 5) The sacrifice was soothing. (vv. 9, 13, 17)
