5 Signposts on the Road to Gospel Repentance

- 1. Realization of wrong. (Lev. 5:15-16; 17-19; 6:1-7; Psalm 19:7-9)
 - Verses 15-16 involve violations against the sacred <u>property</u> of God.
 - Verses 17-19 involve violations against the sacred precepts of God.
 - Verses 6:1-7 involve violations against the sacred people of God.
 - Sometimes we feel guilty because we are guilty.
 - We don't <u>supersede</u> God's standards, we <u>submit</u> to God's standards.
- 2. Recognition of guilt. (Lev. 5:17; 6:4; Luke 18:13; Psalm 51)
 - Sometimes the hardest conversations we will ever have are with the person in the mirror.
- 3. Remorse for our failure. (Num. 5:5-10; 2 Cor. 7:8-16)
 - Authentic <u>conviction</u> leads to honest <u>confession</u>.
 - There is a difference between wordly regret and gospel-centered remorse.
- 4. Restitution for harm (Lev. 5:16; 6:5; Num. 5:7: Mt. 3:8; Luke 19:8; Is. 53:10; Col. 2:13-15)
 - Restitution is a tangible, intentional, material reversal of the harm our sin caused.
 - As God's people, when we sin, we should <u>rush</u> to make it <u>right</u>.
- 5. Reconciliation to God. (Col. 1:21-23; Lev. 5:16, 18; 6:7; Col. 1:21-23; Is. 53:10)
 - Reconciliation to God is the very reason for the gospel itself and the existence of the church.
 - Reconciliation required payment of a <u>penalty</u>.
 - The penalty for sin is <u>punishment</u> in hell.
 - Our guilt offering is Jesus Himself! (Is. 53:10)
