- C. Persevering in the Presence of God (6:8-13)
9. The fire on the altar was to be kept burning all night, every night.
  10. God’s presence was often described as fire.
  11. The continual fire on the altar reminded Israel of God’s presence in their midst.
  12. Jesus promise to send the Spirit of truth to be with us forever. (John 14)
  13. God said to Israel, “I will never leave you, nor forsake you.” (Dt. 31:6; Heb. 13:5)
  14. Nothing can ever separate us from the love of God which is in Christ Jesus. (Rom. 8:39)
  15. The fire also reminded Israel both of their continual need for atonement and their continual access to atonement.
  16. Jesus is our source of eternal salvation. (Heb. 5:8-9)
- D. Submitting to the Standards of God (6:14-7:38)
1. The peace offering a fellowship offering and also a communal meal.
  2. But the offering had to be made, and the meal had to be eaten on God’s terms or else it was unacceptable.
  3. Disregarding God’s instructions made the peace offering and fellowship meal an offensive thing.
  4. We must be clean if we are to celebrate peace with God. (1 Cor. 11:27-30)
