## Be Clean – Part XI Lev. 13-15

- 1. The <u>Consequences</u> of <u>Corruption</u>
  - a. The focus of chapter 13 is on the priests identifying ritual <u>defilement</u>, not making a medical <u>diagnosis</u>.
  - b. The <u>regulations</u> of chapter 15 encouraged sexual <u>restraint</u> by barring unclean people from the sanctuary.
  - c. Sex had to be <u>respected</u> and passions had to be <u>controlled</u>.
  - d. For many ancient pagans, sex was worship (or worshipped).
  - e. And for secular people today, sex is the new <u>opium</u> of the <u>masses</u>.
