## • Two <u>Masters</u> (15-19)

- o In this half of the chapter, instead of <u>participation</u>, Paul uses the illustration of emancipation.
- We are either slaves of <u>sin</u> or slaves of obedience to <u>Christ</u>. (v. 16)
- Again, what is true of us through <u>faith</u> in Christ needs to continually be made true of us through <u>obedience</u> to Christ. (vv. 17-18)
- The point is: Do not <u>presume</u> on God's grace by living in sin, but <u>pursue</u> God's grace by living in righteousness.
- We are to serve our new master even more <u>enthusiastically</u> than we served the old one.
  (v. 19)
- He who has been forgiven much, loves much!

## Two <u>Destinies</u> (20-23)

- o When you were a slave of sin, what real benefits did it bring you? (v. 21)
- Sin always promises more than it <u>delivers</u>, keeps you longer than you wanted to <u>stay</u>, and costs more than you wanted to <u>pay</u>.
