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• The Practical <u>Illustration</u>

- Remember Paul's controversial claim of 5:20: The Law came in so that transgression would increase.

- In verse 1, Paul offers a basic legal <u>principle</u>: Death <u>releases</u> a person from contractual obligations.
- o In verses 2-3, Paul uses marriage as a metaphor to illustrate the principle.
- As long as her husband is alive, she is <u>bound</u> to him. But if he dies, she is legally <u>free</u> to be joined to another.

• The Pivotal Application

- In the same way as death frees a married person from obligation, so also we <u>died</u> to the Law through the <u>body</u> of Christ.
- The central point of this paragraph is that while Christ's death releases us from the <u>Law</u>, it doesn't release us to <u>lawlessness</u>.
- Our death to the Law has two purposes (v. 4):
 - 1) We died to the Law in Christ so that we might be <u>joined</u> to Him who was raised from the dead.
 - 2) We were joined to Christ so that we might <u>bear</u> fruit for God.
- o God doesn't save us so we can be <u>unfaithful</u>, rather, so we will be <u>fruitful</u>.
- But we cannot <u>bear</u> what we have not <u>become</u>.
