 - Israel <u>repeats</u> the mistake Adam and Eve made in the Garden.
 - Breaking God's Law, rebelling against God's purposes for human life results in <u>death</u>.
 - The central point in these verses is that death didn't come from the Law, death came from <u>sin</u> that lives in us.
 - Sin is the mysterious dark <u>power</u> that binds us to disobedience and rebellion against God.
 - Sin is like a <u>predatory</u> animal that always lurks nearby, waiting for an opportunity to kill.
 - Do not attempt to <u>domesticate</u> what is inherently deadly.
- Is the Law <u>Death</u>? (vv. 13-25)
 - Notice that there is a subtle <u>sovereignty</u> ("so that") behind the Law and God's purpose for it.
 - The problem Paul identifies here is the familiar and puzzling problem of akrasia, or weakness of will (vv. 14-20).
 - I know what I <u>ought</u> to do, but I <u>fail</u> to do it.
 - Note: This is <u>not</u> a picture of a saved person who is powerless to war against sin.
 In Christ we have God's Spirit in us and we are no longer slaves to sin (Rom. 6:6).
 - The "I" of chapter 7 finds itself <u>agreeing</u> with God's Law, but unable to fulfill it because of the law of sin.
 - I am stuck between <u>warring</u> powers that I cannot control.
 - Who will <u>save</u> me from this dying body?
