No Condemnation in Christ (vv. 31-34)

- Nothing can stand against God's sovereignty.
- Giving us His Son is God's guarantee that nothing can quench His generosity! (v. 32)
- Question: Who will bring a charge against God's elect? Answer: No one! Since God has already <u>justified</u> us. (v. 33)
- Only Jesus has the authority to condemn me, but He is now my <u>Advocate</u>, <u>Mediator</u>, and Intercessor! (v. 34)

No Separation from Christ (vv. 35-39)

- Who will separate us from the <u>love</u> of Christ? (v. 35)
 - He identifies <u>hardships</u> that God's people encounter in this life.
- Paul quotes from Psalm 44 to illustrates the <u>plight</u> of God's people in this world. (v. 36)
 - o The hardships Paul lists could have come from his own <u>autobiography</u>. (2 Cor. 11:23-28)
 - He was no sideline spectator. Suffering was Paul's constant reality.
- Suffering is the <u>daily reality</u> for Christian brothers and sisters in many places all around the world.
- But in all these things, in all these tears, in all these horrors and heartaches, we are "hypernikao," we are <u>super-conquerors</u> through Him who loved us! (v. 37)
- Paul closes with personal reflections: *I am convinced...*(vv. 38-39)
 - Death itself cannot <u>divide</u> us from Christ because it was His death that <u>united</u> us to Christ!
