 - We are to be <u>authentic</u> <u>agape</u> (loving) people.
 - The word for hypocrite basically means "two-faced."
 - We are to be horrified by evil to the point that we not only find it <u>unattractive</u>, but we are find it repulsive.
 - To be "fervent" in spirit is to <u>boil</u> and <u>burn</u> with passionate adoration for and service to God.
 - Verse 12: Praise, perseverance, and prayer are central to the ongoing life of gospel community.
 - But how do we <u>love</u> our neighbors when we don't even <u>like</u> them?
 - Note that we love ourselves even when we don't like ourselves.
 - We are sorry to find sin in ourselves precisely because we do love ourselves.
 - In the same way, to love others is to value and wish for their good and be grieved by their sin.

 - o Instead we overcome evil by patient endurance, entrusting ourselves to the <u>righteous</u> wrath of God.
