- Judgmental Attitudes & Ultimate Allegiance (vv. 1-12)
 - The big <u>question</u> concerns the role of the Old Testament Law (Torah) in the New Testament church.
 - The "weak" are probably <u>Jewish</u> Christians that are holding on to some of their old traditions.
 - But now, <u>Faith</u> in Christ and the confession of Him as <u>Lord</u> is what defines the <u>people</u> of God
 - Those who don't worry about Jewish sensibilities are the "strong".
 - o Paul is telling the "weak" and the "strong" to stop passing judgment on each other.
 - We cannot and will not compromise on central truths of the gospel.
 - But let us <u>also</u> not to condemn the ones that Jesus has <u>accepted</u>.
 - We must remember that Jesus is <u>Lord</u> and we are <u>not</u>.
- Active <u>Acceptance</u> & Kingdom <u>Concern</u> (vv. 13-23)
 - o Paul isn't going to tell us what to do, as much as show us how to think.
 - We must act according to the ethic of <u>love</u> (v. 15) which is the central principle that should guide our thinking.
 - For Paul, this is about <u>priorities</u> (vv. 17-21). <u>People</u> are more important than <u>preferences</u>.
 - Live <u>consistently</u> with your <u>convictions</u> (vv. 22-23) under the knowledge that Jesus is <u>Lord</u> and it is to Him that we shall all give account.
